As we were going to the place of prayer, we were met by a slave girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners much gain by fortune-telling. ¹⁷She followed Paul and us, crying out, "These men are servants of the Most High God, who proclaim to you the way of salvation." 18 And this she kept doing for many days. Paul, having become greatly annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, "I command you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And it came out that very hour. 19But when her owners saw that their hope of gain was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace before the rulers. ²⁰And when they had brought them to the magistrates, they said, "These men are Jews, and they are disturbing our city. 21They advocate customs that are not lawful for us as Romans to accept or practice." 22The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates tore the garments off them and gave orders to beat them with rods. ²³And when they had inflicted many blows upon them, they threw them into prison, ordering the jailer to keep them safely. ²⁴Having received this order, he put them into the inner prison and fastened their feet in the stocks. ²⁵About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them, ²⁶ and suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken. And immediately all the doors were opened, and everyone's bonds were unfastened. ²⁷When the jailer woke and saw that the prison doors were open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, supposing that the prisoners had escaped. ²⁸But Paul cried with a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." ²⁹And the jailer called for lights

and rushed in, and trembling with fear he fell down before Paul and Silas. ³⁰ Then he brought them out and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" ³¹ And they said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." ³²And they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. ³³And he took them the same hour of the night and washed their wounds; and he was baptized at once, he and all his family. ³⁴ Then he brought them up into his house and set food before them. And he rejoiced along with his entire household that he had believed in God.

THE SERMON

The Rev'd Dr. Michael Matlock "Singing Through the Darkest Night"

SERMON NOTES

The message is focused on Acts 16:25. Paul and Silas not only prayed in prison, they sang. Their music at midnight was not a dirge, but praise. One of our supreme and imperative needs is the need for Christian men and women who have the victorious faith that can sing, not only when the day is bright, but through the darkest night, not only when things are going well, but when they are going ill.

- 1. Singing in the Darkest Night (Psalm 51:12-14; Acts 16:25)
- 2. The Secret of the Midnight Music (Psalm 103:1-2; Matt 28:20)

"He who sings prays twice." St. Augustine indeed recognized the profound connection between singing and a heightened form of prayer, noting that "he who sings praise, not only praises, but also loves Him whom he is singing about/to/for." Singing to God is an act of love, a deeper form of prayer. As we harmonize our voices in our churches and our homes, let us embrace the profound truth that in our singing, we're praying twice!

Reflection: What part of the message do I most need to integrate into my relationship with Christ and His Church? How can my participation through the ministries of Christ Anglican assist me in my obedience to the Lord's calling upon life?

Prayer: Grant me, O Lord, the resilience to endure life's trials and tribulations. Infuse my spirit with unwavering courage, for it is through courage that we conquer our darkest moments. May I find the fortitude to sing and rise above the challenges that seek to drown me in despair. With you by my side, I am delivered from the grasp of darkness, and I emerge as a beacon of your strength. **Amen**.


