

"No More Sea"

## **SERMON NOTES**

The message is focused on Rev 21:1. As John looked across the barren and friendless waste of the Aegean Sea, he felt that there was no place for the sea in the ideal times which were coming. We must look at the subject from John's prison on the rocky, lonely island of Patmos if we would catch the spiritual meaning of the sea-less heaven and earth.

- 1. No More Separation or Limitation (Rev. 21:1; Rom 8:37-39; 1 Cor 15:53-55; Isaiah 40:31)
- 2. No More Unrest or Sin (Rev. 21:5; Mark 4:39; Isaiah 57:20)

Jesus is making all things new (Rev 21:5; Isaiah 43:19) And you and I, His disciples, are helping or hindering Him. He is working as He always does, through human agents. We can do something to lessen the sense of separation and solitude, we can clear away some limiting barriers, we can tell troubled men and women of the rest given, we can point crippled sinners to the Savior, and we can have our share in building the New Jerusalem.

Reflection: What part of the message do I most need to integrate into my relationship with Christ and His Church? How can my participation through the ministries of Christ Anglican assist me in my obedience to the Lord's calling upon life?

Prayer: Loving God, please grant me peace of mind and calm my troubled heart. My soul is like a turbulent sea. I can't seem to find my balance so I stumble and worry constantly. Give me the strength and clarity of mind to find my purpose and walk the path you've laid out for me and believe that you are making all things new. Amen.





## THE PRAYER OF CONSECRATION

**BCP 132** 

The People stand or kneel. The Celebrant continues

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and when we had sinned against you and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent your only Son Jesus Christ into the world for our salvation. By the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary he became flesh and dwelt among us. In obedience to your will, he stretched out his arms upon the Cross and offered himself once for all, that by his suffering and death we might be saved. By his resurrection he broke the bonds of death, trampling Hell and Satan under his feet.

As our great high priest, he ascended to your right hand in glory, that we might come with confidence before the throne of grace.

On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body, which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, Jesus took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the forgiveness of sins: Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, and we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Word and Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Sanctify us also, that we may worthily receive this holy Sacrament, and be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us and we in him. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us with all your saints into the joy of your heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord face to face. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. **Amen.**

## THE MINSTRATION OF COMMUNION
